





The Art of Nevada County Beekeeping

Honey Bees have been around since the beginning of time, but in California for only about 165 years. They came from Europe with the settlers that were here for the gold rush and a new way of life. In 1946, there were estimated to be 5.4 million beehives in the back yards of United States homeowners. Now there are less than half of that.



Pollinators are under attack. This includes honey bees, bumble bees, mason bees, and butterflies, to name a few. This is due to the use of pesticides and herbicides that we, over time, have come to use in our yards and in the farming industry. With the use of these chemicals the honey bee numbers are declining at an alarming rate. Honey bees are responsible for pollinating one-third the food that we eat. So, with no honey bees or pollinators, you might start to get a little hungry.

In Nevada County, there is a movement afoot to do something about the declining Honey bee population. In this community, we have a great resource with local stores, like A to Z Supply, that are bringing the beginning beekeeping population back on track. With beginning beekeeping classes in January, February and March, along with a class taught by Randy Oliver in April, and the most active Nevada County Beekeepers association, you can't go wrong with becoming a beekeeper.



A strong hive has between 25,000 and 60,000 bees in it. They gather nectar which they turn into honey to feed the baby bees being raised in the hive. Then they feed themselves the honey. They also gather pollen for the same purposes. Honey bees are the only insect that provides a food for humans. HONEY! They also pollinate our crops, which provide us with food.

The biggest honey producing states are Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Florida. Only 10% of the honey that is consumed comes from the United States. All other honey is imported from other countries and we don't know if it is truly honey. So, when you buy honey, know your beekeeper.

The Nevada County Beekeepers association meets the first Monday of every month at the Vet's Hall in Grass Valley on South Auburn Street. A to Z Supply carries a full line of beekeeping equipment year-round and they also help new beekeepers get bees for their hives every Spring. So, stop by and talk to the Beekeepers at A to Z and get to know your local beezzzzz.

Shopper's Guide to Terms

One of the best aspects of buying from your local farmers is the opportunity you have to talk with them, learn about the farming practices they use, and why. When you know who grows your food, and how it is grown, you are experiencing true food security.

WHAT, EXACTLY, IS "ORGANIC"?

USDA says "organic food is produced using sustainable agricultural production practices". Not permitted are most conventional pesticides, fertilizers made with synthetic ingredients, sewage sludge, bioengineering or ionizing radiation. Organic meat, poultry, eggs and dairy products come from animals that are given no antibiotics or growth hormones and must be raised on organic pastures. (www.ams.usda.gov) In California all producers wishing to use the term organic must register with the California State Organic Program. (organic.cdfa.ca.gov/organicreg/)

California Certified Organic Producer (CCOF) is a third party certification assigned to farms that are inspected, documented and certified to be following organic practices. (www.ccof.org)

Registered Organic Producer is a farm allowed under USDA and California rules to sell as organic without certification if they sell less than \$5000 in product annually. Register with the California State Organic Program. (organic.cdfa.ca.gov/organicreg/)

WHAT DOES "CERTIFICATION" MEAN AT MY LOCAL GROWER'S MARKET?

A Certified Agricultural Producer sells products grown by that producer and are certified through the County Agricultural Commissioner. It does not mean the products are certified as "organic", or that the products were only grown in the local county area.

WHAT DO GROWING METHODS MEAN?

In the farm listings, many farmers describe their growing methods to better inform their customers of how the crops are handled or animals are raised. Terms such as sustainable, biodynamic, permaculture, regenerative and others relate to methods that aim to maintain or improve the land so farming can continue indefinitely. The goal is to build soil, create year-round biodiversity, conserve water and store carbon in the soil to produce healthy plants and animals as naturally as possible.
